## Be careful who takes your rubbish away

There has been an increase in the number of fly-tipping incidents across the East Riding. The streetscene enforcement team is warning residents about the risks of accepting offers from 'white van man' to dispose of their rubbish.

Residents may not realise they face a fine of up to £5,000 if a firm illegally dumps their waste. All reports of fly-tipping are investigated by the council – and any evidence found is used to bring a prosecution, even if the resident did not dump the materials themselves.

Residents have a duty of care to make sure their waste is disposed of properly. They should check if the firm taking away their waste is registered by asking to see their waste carrier number. They can call the Environment Agency on 08708 506 506 to ask for a waste carrier validation check or look online at [environment-agency.gov.uk](http://environment-agency.gov.uk)

## Christmas Bake-Off

Even though Christmas is months away, keen cooks from across the East Riding are invited to enter the council's Christmas Bake-Off competition. The winner will receive a £100 voucher for East Yorkshire's Michelin Star restaurant, the Pipe and Glass Inn in South Dalton.

The annual contest asks people to come up with an original recipe that uses Christmas leftovers to create a tasty new dish. There are two categories - ages 11-16 and ages 17 and over - so people of all ages can have a go at cooking up something special. The closing date for entries is Monday, 5 October.

The final three chosen from each category will have the opportunity to cook their festive recipe at the Yorkshire Wolds Cookery School at Southburn, near Driffield, on Saturday, 31 October this year – and have their dishes judged by Michelin-starred chef James Mackenzie.

## Shingles vaccine

NHS Vale of York is encouraging eligible residents in the area to get the shingles vaccine.

From Saturday, 1 September the shingles vaccine will be offered routinely to people aged 70 and, as a catchup, to those aged 78. You become eligible for the vaccine on the first day of September after you've turned 70 or 78.

Anyone eligible for immunisation in the first two years of the programme who is not yet vaccinated against shingles remains eligible until their 80<sup>th</sup> birthday. This includes:

- people aged 71 and 72 on 1 September 2015
- people aged 79.

## Check on your neighbour

Humberside Fire and Rescue Service is encouraging residents to spend 10 minutes visiting an elderly neighbour, as well as continuing its campaign of home safety visits.

These visits can make a real difference to their safety, helping prevent fires by checking simple things:

- smoke alarms
- smoking advice
- cooking advice
- use of open fires.



## Connect to support

The organisations on this web-based service offer a wide variety of support and activities: from home care and equipment, to luncheon clubs, reading clubs and befriending schemes. This gives residents more choice and control over their care and support. It provides them with the option to buy the support they need direct from local and national organisations, online.

As well as health and social care services, Connect to Support provides information about organisations offering practical help around the home, such as gardening services, cleaning companies and handyperson schemes.

## Small actions can have large impacts

Has your community been looking at ideas for regular activities for the over-50s but not sure how they will pay for them and is looking for a helping hand? If you are part of a group or small organisation in East Riding of Yorkshire with an idea, the Connecting Communities Grant may be able to help.

We know the damaging effect that loneliness can have on older people's lives. The best way to tackle this is by getting people involved and connected within their communities. This can be through group-based activities or by engaging people with a shared interest. This can combat social isolation and improve the health and wellbeing of people.

Some examples of projects that have been helped are : creative knitting sessions, training in how to use tablet computers, a seaside radio project, social events including tea parties, musical theatre shows and a community cafe.

## Coastal Opportunities

Joel Stockton, coastal opportunities officer, will soon get in touch with local communities and parish councils about the Coastal Opportunities Gateway project. This includes plans to introduce signposts, bike stands and similar to the villages of Skipsea, Aldbrough, Tunstall, Easington and Kilnsea.

Funds are also being allocated to enhance a flood defence in Kilnsea and explore the feasibility of beach access in undefended locations. Before the project ends in December 2016, there will be a series of free tourism events with links to the East Riding Walking and Outdoors Festival.

Bespoke advice is also being offered to eligible businesses to help them realise their growth and diversification ambitions, improve their resilience to severe weather and establish apprenticeships. This free-of-charge, one-to-one support will be complemented by a series of free, specialist business training events.

## Could your home be a Green Open Home?

Have you installed solar panels on your home, a wood-burning stove or a heat pump? If you have had anything fitted to your home to lower your energy bills and make it more eco-friendly by using renewable technologies, then it could become a Green Open Home during the event this autumn.

Humber and Wolds Rural Community Council, working with East Riding of Yorkshire Council, is co-ordinating events which work in a similar way to open gardens. Participating householders with low-carbon measures open their doors on a given day to interested members of the public and share their experience.

Similar events have been very successful in other parts of the country and inspired others to install similar measures. Training and support will be provided to all households volunteering to hold an event.
