New lawnmowers to keep the East Riding tidy

A fleet of brand new lawnmowers will be helping to make the East Riding look neat and tidy this spring and summer. The council has invested \pounds 470,000 in 18 brand new ride-on mowers to launch the start of this year's grass cutting season.

The grounds maintenance team has already started using the machines - 12 heavyduty, triple-cylinder mowers and six high-performance rotary mowers. Another 12 machines will be delivered soon.

The mowers mark the start of a four-year supply agreement with grounds machinery firm Toro, as part of the council's ongoing replacement programme. The new mowers will save 12-15% on fuel and will cost less to maintain and repair.

The council employs 124 grounds staff, with 54 of those being seasonal. They will be out and about in towns and villages until October, cutting grass in parks, open spaces, highway verges and any public area needing a trim.

The grounds team cuts the equivalent of 919 professional football pitches every two weeks. At 6.9 million square metres of grass, that is one of the largest areas of land tended to by any council in the UK.

Foster caring

Do you know someone who has thought about becoming a foster carer? Do they want to find out more? East Riding of Yorkshire Council is hoping to recruit more foster carers, particularly for children aged from 5 to 15.

Anyone who would like to find out what is involved is welcome to come along to one of the 'Find out about fostering' events being held on :

- Tuesday, 16 June, 6pm at Tickton Grange Hotel, Tickton, near Beverley
- Saturday, 11 July, 10.30am at the Hallmark Hotel, North Ferriby.

Almost anyone can apply to be a foster carer. Families come in all shapes and sizes but, as with any career, some people will be more suited to it than others. Prospective foster carers should ideally be over-25. They can be single, married or co-habiting and be people with or without families, heterosexual, lesbian or gay.

The information events will give people who are interested in fostering a chance to meet people who are already involved and find out if becoming a foster carer is for them. They will provide an opportunity to :

- talk to fostering social workers and discuss suitability
- meet foster carers and their birth children
- talk to looked-after young people and hear about their experiences
- find out about free professional training.
